Phonological Awareness: Syllables Routines

Use these routines to engage children in playful activities in which they practice manipulating syllables.

Routine 1: Removing Initial Syllables

- Tell children that they will play a game in which they take away the first syllable in a word.
- Say backpack and have children repeat the word.
- Ask children to say each syllable in backpack: back, pack.
- Guide children to take away the initial syllable.
 Say: Take away the first syllable from backpack. What word is left? (pack)
- Use the following words with this routine to provide on-going practice: bullfrog (frog); hiccup (cup); bathtub (tub); upset (set); eggshell (shell); rabbit (bit); cabin (bin); inside (side).

Routine 2: Removing Final Syllables

- Tell children that they will play a game in which they take away the last syllable in a word.
- · Say backpack and have children repeat the word.
- Ask children to say each syllable in backpack: back, pack.
- Guide children to take away the final syllable.
 Say: Take away the last syllable from backpack. What word is left? (back)
- Use the following words with this routine to provide on-going practice: pencil (pen); napkin (nap); snowstorm (snow); sandwich (sand); insect (in); picnic (pic); attic (at).

Routine 3: Adding Syllables

- Tell children that they will play a game in which they add a syllable to a word.
- Say back and have children repeat the word.
- Guide children to add a syllable to the word. Say: Now say back and add pack to the end of the word. What is the new word? (backpack)
- Use the following words with this routine to provide on-going practice:
 cross + walk (crosswalk); mag + net (magnet); con + test (contest);
 bed + room (bedroom); out + side (outside); plas + tic (plastic); bas + ket (basket).





Routine 4: Changing Syllables

- Tell children that they will play a game in which they change a syllable in a word.
- Say backpack and have children repeat the word.
- Ask children to say each syllable in backpack: back, pack.
- Guide children to change a syllable in the word.
 Say: Change pack to yard. What is the new word? (backyard)
- Use the following words with this routine to provide on-going practice:

bookstore: change store to worm (bookworm)

airport: change port to plane (airplane)

baseball: change base to foot (football)

rocket: change rock to lock (locket)

unless: change less to til (until) cabin: change cab to rob (robin)

daylight: change day to night (nightlight)

snowball: change ball to man (snowman)
